

Health and Safety Plan Summary: Pennridge School District

Initial Effective Date: August 10, 2020

Date this plan will take effect: July 1, 2021

Introduction: School district operations will be implemented in the same manner as those in place prior to the pandemic; the exceptions will be fully described within this document. Pennridge School District was open all year for in person instruction during the 2020-2021 school year. This plan reflects those components we will keep in place to promote general health and safety for all students, employees and visitors as well as remaining compliant with national, state and local health guidance.

1. How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

This plan will continually be monitored to consider updated Federal and State mandates as well as the recommendations of the Bucks County Department of Health (BCDH). The plan will be reviewed and revised as necessary. The revisions will be recommended to the Board for approval and changes will be communicated to students, staff and the greater school community.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

Our methods for educational delivery for the 2021-22 school year will be:

1. Instruction will resume on August 30, 2021 on a normal, Monday through Friday schedule.
2. The following options will be available to families:
 - a. Face to face, in classroom instruction
 - b. Remote instruction will be provided through two models:
 - Full remote sections of students taught by a Pennridge teacher.
 - Utilization of the Pennridge Learning Academy, a full cyber option that has been in place for many years.

To adequately assess our staffing needs to provide these options, a survey was issued to parents/guardians to determine if their child(ren) will be joining us for face-to-face or online instruction for the upcoming school year. Families new to the district will be surveyed upon registration.

Student medical issues which require a temporary leave from school will be addressed on a case by case basis to determine appropriate instructional alternatives to continue the student’s education in consideration of information provided by the student’s health care provider, parent/guardians, principal and counselor, and IEP team, if applicable.

To address the issue of mental health concerns for our students and staff, the following measures will be in place for the 2021-22 school year:

1. Our building staff, school counselors, psychologists, and other support personnel are available to provide mental health support for students and connect families with services
2. Staff will be routinely reminded of how to access the district Employee Assistance Program
3. District Social Workers are available to help support students, staff, and families.
4. Professional development options will continue that support mental health/stress reduction
5. Behavioral health supports will also be available through a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA)

Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation;</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All high-touch surfaces cleaned/disinfected by custodial crew daily (water fountains, door handles, desks, light switches, etc.) following posted EPA/CDC/manufacture guidelines. • Clean desks on a frequent basis (soap and water for students/cleaning solution for faculty/staff). • Students and staff should sanitize/wash hands on a frequent basis. (Make hand sanitizer available in common areas, hallways, and/or in classrooms where sinks for handwashing are not available). • Shared equipment will be cleaned regularly. • Water fountains will remain disconnected and faculty/staff and students are encouraged to bring water bottles from home and use filling stations. • Ventilate all classrooms and common areas when available/possible using windows. Use air circulation pattern that push inside air towards open windows. Doors and windows will be open to the maximum extent feasible. Ceiling fans will be operational to promote proper ventilation. Pedestal fans will be used in multipurpose rooms/gyms/cafeterias. If AC is running - doors and windows will be closed. Exterior doors will remain locked. • Filters will be evaluated and replaced when necessary. • Air handlers will be monitored to ensure appropriate air circulation.
<p>e. Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use strategies similar to those used with influenza, other infectious diseases in the event of a confirmed case of COVID 19.

<p>State and local health departments;</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students and employees are encouraged to report positive cases of COVID 19 to their building nurse • Consult with the Bucks County Health Department on decisions impacting the closure of classrooms, schools, or the district.

Diagnostic and screening testing;</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Educate all stakeholders (students, staff, parents/guardians) on the signs and symptoms of COVID-19 at home before sending children to school and/or reporting to work. • The nurse or designated employee will evaluate any individual who presents with symptoms. • School nurse medical record tracking system currently in place for students will be used to monitor symptoms/exposure history for all employees, including the tracking of vaccinations as required by law. • Emergency contacts must be up to date. When requested, symptomatic students will be picked up and will not be sent home on the bus.
<p>g. Efforts to provide vaccinations to school communities;</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue to work with BCDH to provide opportunities for students and community members to receive vaccinations.

Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Director of Pupil Services, IEP case managers, school nurses, principals and counselors will work with families to develop a student-specific education plan for students with complex needs. • The district will also collaborate with BCIU and other education providers to coordinate plans for students with complex needs.
<p>i. Coordination with state and local health officials.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Regular communication will continue with the Bucks County Department of Health to confirm updated guidance from the federal and state health officials.
